On the agenda for the July 7th meeting is the voting to remove stumps and stones in the lake.


A motion was made and seconded to rescind electricity to Mr. Banze out on the island.

May 15, 1948 Gilbert F. Perry C.E." on file in the land records of the town of Lebanon." There is a question as to the "Acre" is on the Map. Mr. Brennan will appoint someone at the end of this meeting to look into this matter. Mr. Wilson suggested we use the 1st beach for a Marina rather than spend money outside our territories.

Mr. Rittlinger asked if we could have a sign put up near the "Circle". Mr. Omicioli will check into this.

## Boaters Told to Obey Lake Williams Rules

LEBANON (Special)—Local authorities report there have been many boating violations, the most recent just last week at Lake Williams, and urge witnesses of any incidents to notify the auxiliary police.

The auxiliaries are appointed by State Police Commissioner Leo Hinchey and certified by State Boating Commissioner Bernard Choleski.

Raymond Miller at 642-7141, John Wilcox at 642-7361 and Raymond Mahoney at 642-7672 patrol the lake on weekends.

The auxiliary police urge all boat operators to observe the boating law requiring them to stay 100 feet from swimmers and docks and 75 feet from other boats. A life preserver for each occupant is also required.
